


TRAVIS COUNTY COURTS AT LAW PERSONAL BOND GUIDELINES

There shall be a presumption of personal bond in all misdemeanors in Travis County that do not pose a danger to community and/or individual safety. Bonds should use the least restrictive means possible to ensure community and/or individual safety and the defendant's return to court.

1. All personal bonds applications should
 - a. be evaluated by Pretrial Services, unless there are exigent circumstances;
 - b. be fully completed before presentation;
 - c. contain a criminal history; and
 - d. contain the attorney's name and address, if presented by an attorney.
2. A bond for any misdemeanor may be considered by any magistrate. Pursuant to CCP Art.42A.751(c), bonds in cases involving a Motion to Revoke Probation or Motion to Adjudicate should be presented to the judge who ordered the arrest for the alleged violation.
3. If an attorney presents a bond that has been previously declined, the attorney shall inform the judge considering the bond, if asked.
