### GENERAL LEGAL INFORMATION

- **Travis County Law Library Self-Help Center** <http://www.traviscountylawlibrarv.org> 512.854.8677. Ned Granger Building, 314 West 11th Street, Austin. Law library services, legal resources and information, free self-help forms for divorce and other family law matters. Staff attorneys are available to assist parties with UNCONTESTED family cases in Travis County only. *Uncontested* means that the parties are in agreement. Staff attorneys do not individually represent either side. All library services are free.
- **First Call for Help • 211** Call 2-1-1 for free information and referrals to health and human service agencies, nonprofit organizations and other services.
- **Texas Law Help** [www.texaslawhelp.org](http://www.texaslawhelp.org) One-stop resource for free legal information in multiple languages. Topics include housing, public benefits, family, veterans, wills and probate and many others. Free self-help legal forms are available for download, with instructions in English and Spanish.
- **Telephone Access to Justice** 512.374.2777 or 888.988.9996. A service of Texas Rio Grande Legal Aid (TRLA) [www.trla.org](http://www.trla.org). Callers are screened for eligibility for free legal services in civil legal matters, including family, consumer, housing, and public benefits. No criminal matters.
- **Texas Legal Services Center** [www.tlsc.org](http://www.tlsc.org) 800.622.2520. Administers a variety of legal service programs for eligible individuals. Lawyer-staffed legal line primarily for Texans who have a disability or are over 60 years of age. Most services available at no cost to eligible applicants.
- **MATCH Program** 512.472.8303 or 866.303.8303 (ask for "MATCH" program). Reduced-fee private attorneys for those who meet income eligibility guidelines. Limited to family law, guardianship, and simple wills. Consultation is \$20 for the first 30 minutes; reduced hourly rate thereafter. No online referrals. Legal services are not free.

### CHILD SUPPORT, MEDICAL SUPPORT, PATERNITY

## **DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, DATING VIOLENCE, SEXUAL ASSAULT**

**NOTE** - Clear your phone and/or web browser history after contacting these organizations.

**Protective Orders**- A Protective Order is an order signed by a judge to protect individuals and families from domestic abuse and violence. The order requires an abuser to follow certain rules or face serious legal consequences. These rules can include staying away from your family, payment of child support, and family visitation under supervision. Most protective orders are for a period of up to 2 years, but some are for a longer period depending on facts. *If you have experienced violence, apply right away. A delay can affect whether your application for a protective order can be accepted.*

**Travis County Attorney's Office** - Apply in person Mon-Fri 8am-5pm. Spanish interpreters available. Ned Granger Bldg. 314 W.11th St. Suite 300. Required: Valid government issued ID; valid address of the person you need to be protection from.
