- To develop innovative strength-based plans that respond to the needs of children and their families through the partnership between CPC and the family.



Who does CPC Serve?

Travis County residents between the ages of 0 - 22 who:

- Require multiple system involvement
- Have physical challenges, mental health challenges, and/or developmental disabilities that significantly impact their ability to function in home, school and/or the community

How does CPC partner with families?

1. Creates a plan for child and family success
2. Identifies available community resources
3. Strengthens the family's support system
4. Empowers families and their children to reach their fullest potential
