

What is the purpose of the Community Partners for Children (CPC) meeting?

- To provide a forum for families to address their children's complex needs
- To form partnerships between parents, private and public agencies and the community as a whole
- To facilitate partners bringing their expertise and community resources to the group
- To develop innovative strength-based recommendations that respond to the needs of children and their families through the partnership between CPC and the family



Who does CPC Serve?

Travis County residents between the ages of 0 - 22 who:

- Require multiple system involvement
- Have physical challenges, mental health challenges, and/or developmental disabilities that significantly impact their ability to function in home, school and/or the community

How does CPC partner with families?

1. Creates a list of recommendations for the child and family
2. Identifies available community resources & supports for the child and family
3. Strengthens the child & family's support systems
4. Empower the child & family to reach their fullest potential
