**The Steering Committee Charge**

The Palm School Steering Committee (the Committee) will be an active partner in the Palm School Concept Plan development process and in efforts leading up to the restoration and reimagining of the Palm School property. Working in partnership with the County’s consultant and staff, the Steering Committee will:

1. Provide input for the design of a community engagement plan that will be used to inform a Concept Plan for the Palm School property
2. Review and offer feedback on processes, plans, and materials created by the consultant leading up to and including the Concept Plan for the Palm School property
3. Review and offer feedback on processes, plans, and materials created by staff and/or consultants related to any restoration and reimagining of the Palm School property
4. Provide a consensus recommendation to the Commissioners Court on the community engagement process used to inform a Concept Plan and the Concept Plan for the Palm School property

**4. Historic Designations**

Historic designation at the City of Austin level provides a zoning overlay for the property that limits development possibilities and changes to the property. Properties that have been designated as historic are still bound by the existing zoning but also adopts zoning overlay restrictions. The current zoning of the Palm School property is Community Commercial with a Historic Overlay.

TxDOT reports that Palm School meets federal historic criteria but did not designate it for special restrictions because their highway expansion plans do not impact the building.

A National Register of Historic Places (NEHP federal designation would not protect Palm School further than current protections. Steering Committee members performed a consensus check was made on the possibility to pursue NRHP designation, but the consensus check was not passed.

**5. TxDOT Publicly Available Information**

There is a proposed shared use path on the south side of the Palm School property, but it is too small for mitigation for takings. The proposed driveway on the east side of the property is the existing driveway on the property.
